Disaster Recovery Center Opens:

Clay County's Emergency Management team announces that a Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) will open at the Clay County Fairgrounds, Building 3, Sunday, Sept. 24 at 1:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. The DRC will be open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. through Saturday, Sept. 30. The Clay County Fairgrounds is located at 2497 State Road 16 West, Green Cove Springs, FL 32043.

A DRC is a mobile office where Clay County residents impacted by Hurricane Irma may get more information about various disaster assistance programs and ask questions related to their specific case. They can assist with:

- Registration for federal disaster assistance
- SBA Loan application and processing
- Case updates and status checks
- Processing appeals to eligibility determinations regarding federal assistance
- Connection to other State program information or assistance

Unmet Needs:

We ask that any Clay County residents with unmet needs (other than electricity), contact the call center at 904-284-7703 between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

Yard Debris:

Clay County citizens can use a temporary residential vegetative debris only drop site in the Fairgrounds back parking lot daily from 7:30am to 5:30pm. All residential customers are asked to use the entrance to the fairgrounds off Spring Bank Rd. The rear parking area at the fair, will be set up for our residents to drive in, and drop yard debris only. This is to ease the traffic congestion that we have experienced at our landfill sites. We are working as expeditiously as possible to continue the level of service residents are accustomed to.


Debris Removal/Garbage/Waste Management:

While recycling and curbside service (normal household garbage) have resumed their normal schedule, we are currently running behind due to the heavy volume.

Construction and Demolition Debris (drywall, carpet, etc.) is being picked up throughout the county now and will continue to be done until our Hurricane Irma debris recovery efforts are completed.

Make sure that all types of debris are separated, such as electronics, large appliances, vegetative, construction debris and household garbage. If it is mixed, it WILL NOT be picked up. Do not stack your debris around mail boxes, cable boxes, or other types of road side structures (see diagram below).
